## World Memory Project

United States **Holocaust Memorial Museum** has collected more than 170 million documents detailing the experiences of individual victims of the Holocaust and Nazi persecution during World War II. Now [Ancestry.com](http://Ancestry.com) is partnering with the Museum to create the World Memory Project, which allows anyone, anywhere to help make these documents searchable online for free — so more families can discover what happened to loved ones victimized by the Nazis during one of the darkest chapters in human history.

### Here's how you can help.

You may have heard of the Ancestry World Archives Project, our established community that has spent years preserving historical documents and making them searchable online for free. The World Memory Project is using the same software and processes to build the largest free online resource for information about individual victims of the Holocaust and Nazi persecution during World War II.

The Brooklyn Daily Eagle was published from 1841 to 1955, then revived for a short time from 1960 to 1963.
