Before you start delving into digital books and digital libraries, you should read *Digital Libraries* by William Y. Arms. You will find the book at <http://www.cs.cornell.edu/wya/DigLib/>. The author states that the book that he wrote in 1998 is now seriously out of date. The author further states "The book does not have a bibliography, because, only a few years ago, nobody had confidence in the longevity of URLs. Now it is clear that many online collections are managed for the long term and can be cited with confidence." It is not books that are out of date, it is the technology being used to display them on the Internet.
